WHEREAS, parcel tax revenue can provide a stable, predictable source of school revenue; and

WHEREAS, passage of SCA 5 will empower local voters to invest in their schools based on the needs of their communities by requiring a tough, but fair, 55 percent vote to pass local parcel taxes, while protecting taxpayers and homeowners with accountability provisions that will ensure that funds generated from parcel taxes are not wasted or mismanaged; and

WHEREAS, revenue from parcel taxes can be spent according to local priorities and are not subject to state control; and

WHEREAS, the two-thirds vote requirements result in minority rule by requiring two "yes" votes to cancel out one no vote; and

WHEREAS, passage of SCA 5 will allow local voters to decide to make investments in their neighborhood schools in addition to state funding;

NOW, **THEREFORE**, **BE IT RESOLVED** that the governing board of the Placentia-Yorba Linda Unified School District strongly urges the California State Legislature to support and adopt SCA 5.

THE GOVERNING BOARD OF THE PLACENTIA-YORBA LINDA UNIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT ADOPTING A MITIGATED NEGATIVE DECLARATION FOR THE PROPOSED PERFORMING ARTS CENTER PROJECT AND INSTRUCTION TO FILE A NOTICE OF DETERMINATION

WHEREAS, the Placentia-Yorba Linda Unified School District ("School District") proposes to construct a Performing Arts Center located at El Dorado High School in the City of Placentia, County of Orange ("Project Site," more particularly shown on figures in the Initial Study);

WHEREAS, the School District further proposes to construct the District Performing Arts Center upon the Project Site consisting of the (construction of the school facilities compose the "Project");

WHEREAS, prior to commencement of the Project, the School District must comply with the California Environmental Quality Act ("CEQA");

WHEREAS, the School District retained Planning Center, Inc. to prepare an initial study for the Project ("Initial Study") to ascertain whether the Project may have a significant impact on the environment;

WHEREAS, the Initial Study discloses there is no substantial evidence that the Project will have a significant effect on the environment if certain mitigation measures are adopted;

WHEREAS, on the basis of the Initial Study, School District staff determined that a Mitigated Negative Declaration should be prepared for the Project;

WHEREAS, the Mitigated Negative Declaration was prepared pursuant to CEQA and the State CEQA Guidelines;

WHEREAS, pursuant to CEQA, and Title 14, California Code of Regulations, Section 15072, the School District has given notice to the public and other agencies that the Project will not have a significant effect on the environment and that the School District proposes to adopt a Mitigated Negative Declaration for the Project;

WHEREAS, the School District, as the lead agency for the Project, provided copies of the Mitigated Negative Declaration and Initial Study to the public for review and comment pursuant to Public Resources Code sections 21091 and 21092;

WHEREAS, the School District received, considered and responded to comments received from the public and other interested agencies regarding the Mitigated Negative Declaration;

WHEREAS, pursuant to Public Resources Code section 21151.8 the School District has given notice to and consulted with the governing air quality management district ("Air Quality District") requesting identification of facilities located within one-fourth of a mile of the Project Site which might reasonably be anticipated to emit hazardous air emissions or acutely hazardous materials, substances, or waste;

WHEREAS, consultation with the Air Quality District regarding the Project has resulted in the conclusion that no facilities have been identified which might emit hazardous air emissions or acutely hazardous materials, substances, or waste;

WHEREAS, pursuant to Public Resources Code section 21151.8(a) the School District has investigated the Project Site by consulting with environmental consultants to determine if the Project Site constitutes a hazardous substance area as described in Public Resources Code section 21151.8(a);

WHEREAS, such consultation and investigation concerning whether the Project Site constitutes a hazardous substance area has resulted in the conclusion that the Project Site does not constitute a hazardous substance area as described in Public Resources Code section 21151.8(a);

WHEREAS, the Mitigated Negative Declaration includes mitigation measures which if adopted will mitigate the impacts of the Project to a level of insignificance ("Mitigation Measures");

WHEREAS, the School District's governing Board has considered the Initial Study and the Mitigated Negative Declaration for the Project, and held a public hearing on the adoption of the proposed Mitigated Negative Declaration for the Project.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Board of the School District hereby finds, determines, declares, orders and resolves as follows:

<u>Section 1.</u> That all of the recitals set forth above are true and correct, and the Board so finds and determines.

<u>Section 2.</u> That pursuant to CEQA and Title 14, California Code of Regulations, Section 15074, there is no substantial evidence that the Project will have a significant effect on the environment if the Mitigation Measures are adopted.

<u>Section 3.</u> That pursuant to Public Resources Code section 21151.8 consultation with the Air Quality District has identified no facilities which might emit hazardous air emissions or acutely hazardous materials, substances or waste within one fourth of a mile of the Project Site.

<u>Section 4.</u> That pursuant to Public Resources Code section 21151.8(a) consultations and investigations have determined that the Project Site does not constitute a hazardous substances area as described in Public Resources Code section 21151.8(a).

<u>Section 5.</u> That the School District has complied with Public Resources Code section 21092.6.

<u>Section 6</u>. That the Project is hereby approved and the Mitigated Negative Declaration is hereby adopted for the Project and that the District adopts the Mitigation Measures as set forth in the Mitigated Negative Declaration ("Mitigation Monitoring Plan").

<u>Section 7</u>. That the School District's staff is instructed to file a Notice of Determination and a Certificate of Fee Exemption for the Project with the Clerk of the County of Orange and with the Office of Planning and Research of the State of California.

<u>Section 8.</u> That this resolution shall be effective as of the date of its adoption.

RESOLUTION NO. 50

RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF EDUCATION OF THE PLACENTIA-YORBA LINDA UNIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT AUTHORIZING THE EXECUTION AND DELIVERY OF A SITE LEASE AND SUBLEASE AND OTHER ACTS RELATING TO THE VALENCIA HIGH SCHOOL NINE (9) PORTABLE CLASSROOM INSTALLATION PROJECT

WHEREAS, the Placentia-Yorba Linda Unified School District ("District") desires to construct improvements on a portion of the Valencia High School campus as a lease-leaseback project whereby the District will lease the Site which the District owns to Paul C. Miller Construction Company, Inc., who will construct the Project thereon and lease the Project and underlying Site back to the District;

WHEREAS, Education Code Section 17406 authorizes the governing board of a school district, without advertising for bids, to let to any person, firm or corporation any real property belonging to the district if the instrument by which such property is let requires the lessee to construct on the demised premises, a building or buildings for use of the school district during the term thereof, and provides that title to the building shall vest in the school at the expiration of that term;

WHEREAS, it is in the best interest of the District to cause the construction of the Project through lease and sublease of the Site pursuant to Education Code Section 17406;

WHEREAS, in order to complete the Project, it is necessary that the District enter into the Site Lease, in which the Site will be leased to Paul C. Miller Construction Company, Inc., and a Sublease which provides for the sublease of the Site and the lease of the Project by Paul C. Miller Construction Company, Inc. to the District, and that certain other action be taken and authorized;

WHEREAS, the Sublease includes construction provisions with which Paul C. Miller Construction Company, Inc. shall comply with respect to construction of the Project ("Construction Services Agreement");

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 17402 of the Education Code, the plans and specifications for the Project must be prepared and adopted prior to entering into Site Lease and the Sublease agreement for the Project ("Plans and Specifications");

WHEREAS, the Plans and Specifications have been approved by the Division of State Architect ("DSA");

WHEREAS, in order to ensure that moneys sufficient to pay all costs will be available for the Project, the District desires to appropriate funds for the Project from its current fiscal year as provided by the Sublease;

WHEREAS, the Board has been presented with the Plans and Specifications for the Project and has examined and approves of such documents, subject to minor revisions, if any, by DSA, and subject to the delegation of authority provided by the Board as set forth below;

WHEREAS, the Board has been presented with the form of each document referred to herein relating to the transaction contemplated hereby and the Board has examined and approved each document and desires to authorize and direct the execution of such documents and the consummation of such transaction, subject to the delegation of authority provided by the Board as set forth below;

WHEREAS, all acts, conditions, and things required by the laws of the State of California to exist, to have happened and to have been performed precedent to and in connection with the consummation of the transaction authorized hereby, do exist, have happened and have been performed in regular and due time, form and manner as required by law, and the District is now duly authorized and empowered, pursuant to each and every requirement of law, to consummate such financing for the purpose, in the manner, and upon the terms herein provided.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE BOARD OF EDUCATION OF THE PLACENTIA- YORBA LINDA UNIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT DOES HEREBY RESOLVE, DETERMINE, AND ORDER AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. <u>Recitals</u>. All of the recitals herein contained are true and correct.

Section 2. <u>Site Lease and Sublease</u>. The form of agreement entitled "Site Lease" and the form of agreement entitled "Sublease" (with Construction Services Agreement attached thereto as Exhibit "D"), each presented to this meeting and each to be entered into by and between the District and Paul C. Miller Construction Company, Inc., which together provide generally for (i) the lease by the District of the Site to Paul C. Miller Construction Company, Inc., (ii) the sublease of the Site and the lease of the Project by Paul C. Miller Construction Company, Inc. to the District, and (iii) the payment of certain lease payments by the District under the Sublease in an amount equal to the aggregate construction costs for the Project as set forth in the Construction Services Agreement ("Lease Payments") are hereby approved subject to any revisions which are acceptable to both District's Superintendent ("Superintendent") and District's legal counsel. The Superintendent or their designee is hereby authorized and directed, for and in the name and on behalf of the District, to execute and deliver to Paul C. Miller Construction Company, Inc. such agreements, once finalized, pursuant to the delegation of authority provided for hereby.

Section 3. <u>Approval of Process</u>. The Governing Board hereby approves of the lease-leaseback process and approves of the Guaranteed Maximum Price amount of SIX HUNDRED FIFTY SIX THOUSAND SEVEN HUNDRED THIRTY FIVE HUNDRED DOLLLARS (\$656,735.00) plus a District Contingency amount of THIRTY TWO THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED THIRTY SEVEN DOLLARS (\$ 32,837.00), for a total amount of SIX HUNDRED EIGHTY NINE THOUSAND FIVE HUNDRED SEVENTY TWO DOLLARS (\$ 689,572.00), for the construction of the Project pursuant to the terms of the Construction Services Agreement.

Section 4. <u>Approval of Plans and Specifications</u>. The Governing Board hereby approves of the DSA-approved Plans and Specifications for the Project.

Section 5. <u>Validation Action</u>. The Board hereby authorizes District counsel to file and litigate an appropriate validation action, as required, in the appropriate court with respect to the construction of the Project and the matters approved by this Resolution.

Section 6. <u>Other Acts; Delegation</u>. The District's Governing Board hereby approves a delegation of authority and appoints the District Superintendent, or the designee of the District Superintendent, who is/are hereby authorized and directed, to execute and deliver the Site Lease and Sublease as provided by Section 2 above, execute and deliver documents and/or negotiate documents with Paul C. Miller Construction Company, Inc. and as required execute court pleadings or documents necessary to effectuate the prompt litigation of the validation action, and to do any and all things necessary, in consultation with the staff, that they may deem necessary or advisable in order to effectuate the purpose and intent of this Resolution, all subject to ratification of the Board of Education, if necessary. Said delegation shall be valid during the construction of the Project, or until otherwise rescinded by the Governing Board. Section 7. <u>Effective Date</u>. This Resolution shall take effect upon adoption.

RESOLUTION NO. 49

RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF EDUCATION OF THE PLACENTIA-YORBA LINDA UNIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT AUTHORIZING DELIVERY AND SALE OF 2011 CERTIFICATES OF PARTICIPATION IN THE MAXIMUM PRINCIPAL AMOUNT OF \$24,000,000 TO REFINANCE 2003 CERTIFICATES OF PARTICIPATION AND LEASE OBLIGATIONS AND FINANCE ADDITIONAL SCHOOL FACILITIES, AND APPROVING RELATED DOCUMENTS AND ACTIONS

WHEREAS, the California School Boards Association Finance Corporation (the "Corporation") has been formed for the purpose of providing financial assistance to California school districts, and to that end the Corporation has previously entered into a Lease Agreement dated as of June 1, 2003 (the "2003 Series B Lease Agreement"), with the Placentia-Yorba Linda Unified School District (the "District") under which the Corporation has leased the real property constituting Rio Vista Elementary School (the "2003 Leased Property") to the District in consideration of the payment of semiannual lease payments by the District; and

WHEREAS, the lease payments under the 2003 Series B Lease Agreement are evidenced by 2003 Certificates of Participation 2003, Series B, executed and delivered in the aggregate principal amount of \$5,550,000 (the "2003 Series B Certificates"), the proceeds of which were applied to finance the construction of various school facilities of the District; and

WHEREAS, the District previously entered into lease transactions with Sun Trust Leasing Corporation (the "Sun Trust Leases") and

WHEREAS, the lease payments under the Sun Trust Leases are payable from any source of legally available funds of the District, including tax increment revenues which the District is entitled to receive under agreements with various redevelopment agencies (the "Tax Increment Revenues"); and

WHEREAS, in order to consolidate outstanding debt, the District wishes at this time to refinance its obligations with respect to the 2003 Series B Certificates and the Sun Trust Leases, and the District further wishes to raise proceeds to finance additional projects; and

WHEREAS, funds for such purposes will be provided from the proceeds of 2011 Certificates of Participation to be delivered in the maximum principal amount of \$24,000,000 (the "2011 Certificates"); and

WHEREAS, the Board of Education wishes at this time to authorize and approve all proceedings for the refinancing of the District's obligations with respect to the 2003 Series B Certificates and the Sun Trust Leases and the financing of additional projects, the delivery and sale of the 2011 Certificates for that purpose and all related documents and actions, in furtherance of the public purposes of the District;

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED by the Board of Education of the Placentia-Yorba Linda Unified School District as follows:

Section 1. Approval of Refinancing Plan and Related Documents. The Board of Education approves the refinancing plan outlined above. To that end, the Board of Education approves each of the following financing documents in substantially the respective forms on file with the Clerk of the Board, together with any changes therein or additions thereto deemed advisable by the Superintendent, whose execution thereof shall be conclusive evidence of such approval:

(a) Site Lease between the District as lessor and the Corporation as lessee, under which the District shall lease the 2003 Leased Property, Kraemer Middle School and Tuffree Middle School or other appropriate sites to the Corporation or other appropriate entity.

(b) Lease Agreement between the Corporation or other appropriate entity as lessor and the District as lessee, under which the Corporation shall lease Kraemer Middle School and Tuffree Middle School or other appropriate sites back to the District, and the District agrees to pay semiannual lease payments from the Tax Increment Revenues and other legally available funds as required to implement the financing plan.

(c) Trust Agreement among the District, the Corporation or other appropriate entity and U.S. Bank National Association, as trustee or such other trustee designated by the Superintendent (the "Trustee"), under which the Trustee agrees to execute and deliver the 2011 Certificates, and which specifies the detailed terms and provisions relating to the 2011 Certificates.

(d) Purchase Contract among the District, the Corporation or other appropriate entity and George K. Baum & Company, as underwriter (the "Underwriter"), under which the District agrees to sell the 2011 Certificates to the Underwriter.

The Superintendent is authorized and directed for and in the name and on behalf of the District to execute, and the Clerk of the Board is hereby authorized and directed to attest and affix the seal of the District to, the final form of each of the foregoing documents. The schedule of lease payments attached to the Lease Agreement shall correspond to the payments of principal and interest represented by the 2011 Certificates, to be determined upon the sale thereof as set forth in Section 2.

Section 2. Sale of 2011 Certificates. The Board of Education approves the negotiated sale of the 2011 Certificates in one or more series to the Underwriter in accordance with the Purchase Contract which is approved under Section 1. The Underwriter must purchase the 2011 Certificates for an Underwriter's discount not to exceed 0.90% of the par amount thereof, exclusive of costs of issuance paid by the Underwriter, and the true interest cost to be represented by the Certificates may not exceed the maximum allowed by law.

Section 3. Official Statement. The Board of Education hereby approves and deems nearly final within the meaning of Rule 15c2-12 of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934, the preliminary Official Statement describing the 2011 Certificates in the form on file with the Superintendent. The Superintendent is authorized, at the request of the purchaser of the 2011 Certificates, to execute an appropriate certificate affirming the Board of Education determination that the preliminary Official Statement has been deemed nearly final within the meaning of said Rule. The Superintendent is further authorized and directed to approve any changes in or additions to a final form of said Official Statement, and the execution thereof by the Superintendent will be conclusive evidence of approval of any such changes and additions. The Board of Education authorizes the distribution of the Official Statement by the Underwriter.

Section 4. Official Actions. The Superintendent, the Assistant Superintendent, Administrative Services, the Administrative Director, Fiscal Services, the Clerk of the Board and all other officers of the District are each authorized and directed in the name and on behalf of the District to make any and all assignments, certificates, requisitions, agreements, notices, consents, instruments of conveyance, warrants and other documents, which they or any of them might deem necessary or appropriate in order to consummate any of the transactions contemplated by the agreements and documents approved pursuant to this Resolution including the agreement with Jones Hall, A Professional Law Corporation to serve as Special Counsel and Disclosure Counsel in regard to the 2011 Certificates.

Whenever in this resolution any officer of the District is authorized to execute or countersign any document or take any action, such execution, countersigning or action may be taken on behalf of such officer by any person designated by such officer to act on his or her behalf in the case such officer is absent or unavailable.

Section 5. Effective Date. This Resolution shall take effect from and after the date of its passage and adoption.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Notice of Layoff be given in accordance with the appropriate provisions of the California Education Code and any agreement between the District and classified employees.

EXHIBIT B

45117. (a) When, as a result of the expiration of a specially funded program, classified positions must be eliminated at the end of any school year, and classified employees will be subject to lay off for lack of funds, the employees to be laid off at the end of the school year shall be given written notice on or before April XX informing them of their layoff effective at the end of the school year and of their displacement rights, if any, and reemployment rights. However, if the termination date of any specially funded program is other than June 30, the notice shall be given not less than 45 days prior to the effective date of their layoff.

(b) When, as a result of a bona fide reduction or elimination of the service being performed by any department, classified employees shall be subject to layoff for lack of work, affected employees shall be given notice of layoff not less than 45 days prior to the effective date of layoff, and informed of their displacement rights, if any, and reemployment rights.

(c) (1) A classified employee may not be laid off if a short-term employee is retained to render a service that the classified employee is qualified to render. This subdivision does not create a 45-daylayoff notice requirement for any individual hired as a short-term employee, as defined in Section 45103, for a period not exceeding 45days.

(2) This subdivision does not apply to the retention of a short-term employee, as defined in Section 45103, who is hired for a period not exceeding 45 days after which the short-term service may not be extended or renewed.

(d) This section does not preclude the governing board of a school district from implementing either of the following actions without providing the notice required by subdivision (a) or (b):

(1) A layoff for a lack of funds in the event of an actual and existing financial inability to pay the salaries of classified employees.

(2) A layoff for a lack of work resulting from causes not foreseeable or preventable by the governing board.

(e) This section shall apply to districts that have adopted the merit system in the same manner and effect as if it were a part of Article 6 (commencing with Section 45240).

45298. Persons laid off because of lack of work or lack of funds are eligible to reemployment for a period of 39 months and shall be reemployed in preference to new applicants. In addition, such persons laid off have the right to participate in promotional examinations within the district during the period of 39 months.

Employees who take voluntary demotions or voluntary reductions in assigned time in lieu of layoff or to remain in their present positions rather than be reclassified or reassigned, shall be granted the same rights as persons laid off and shall retain eligibility to be considered for reemployment for an additional period of up to 24 months; provided, that the same tests of fitness under which they qualified for appointment to the class shall still apply. The personnel commission shall make the determination of the specific period eligibility for reemployment on a class-by-class basis.

Employees who take voluntary demotions or voluntary reductions in assigned time in lieu of layoff shall be, at the option of the employee, returned to a position in their former class or to positions with increased assigned time as vacancies become available, and without limitation of time, but if there is a valid reemployment list they shall be ranked on that list in accordance with their proper seniority.

45308. Classified employees shall be subject to layoff for lack of work or lack of funds. Whenever a classified employee is laid off, the order of layoff within the class shall be determined by length of service. The employee who has been employed the shortest time in the class, plus higher classes, shall be laid off first. Reemployment shall be in the reverse order of layoff.

For purposes of this section, in school districts with an average daily attendance below 400,000, for service commencing or continuing after July 1, 1971, "length of service" means all hours in paid status, whether during the school year, a holiday, recess, or during any period that a school is in session or closed, but does not include any hours compensated solely on an overtime basis as provided for in

Section 45128. Nothing in this section shall preclude the governing board of a school district from entering into an agreement with the exclusive representative of the classified employees that defines "length of service" to mean the hire date. For purposes of this section, in school districts with an average daily attendance of

400,000 or more, for service commencing or continuing after January

1, 1986, "length of service" shall be determined by the date of hire.

If a governing board enters into an agreement with the exclusive representative of classified employees that defines "length of service" to mean the hire date, the governing board may define "length of service" to mean the hire date for a classification of employee not represented by any exclusive bargaining unit.

Nothing contained in this section shall preclude the granting of" length of service" credit for time spent on unpaid illness leave, unpaid maternity leave, unpaid family care leave, or unpaid industrial accident leave. In addition, for military leave of absence, "length of service" credit shall be granted pursuant to Section 45297. In the event an employee returns to work following any other unpaid leave of absence, no further seniority shall be accrued for the time not worked.

"Hours in paid status" shall not be interpreted to mean any service performed prior to entering into a probationary or permanent status in the classified service of the district except service in restricted positions as provided in this chapter.
