RESOLUTION NO. 17

RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF EDUCATION OF THE PLACENTIA-YORBA LINDA UNIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT AUTHORIZING THE EXECUTION AND DELIVERY OF A SITE LEASE AND SUBLEASE AND OTHER ACTS RELATING TO THE PERFORMING ARTS CENTER PROJECT AT EL DORADO HIGH SCHOOL

WHEREAS, the Placentia-Yorba Linda Unified School District ("District") desires to construct improvements on a portion of the El Dorado High School campus as a lease-leaseback project whereby the District will lease the Site which the District owns to Swinerton Builders, who will construct the Project thereon and lease the Project and underlying Site back to the District;

WHEREAS, Education Code Section 17406 authorizes the governing board of a school district, without advertising for bids, to let to any person, firm or corporation any real property belonging to the district if the instrument by which such property is let requires the lessee to construct on the demised premises, a building or buildings for use of the school district during the term thereof, and provides that title to the building shall vest in the school at the expiration of that term;

WHEREAS, it is in the best interest of the District to cause the construction of the Project through lease and sublease of the Site pursuant to Education Code Section 17406;

WHEREAS, in order to complete the Project, it is necessary that the District enter into the Site Lease, in which the Site will be leased to Swinerton Builders, and a Sublease which provides for the sublease of the Site and the lease of the Project by Swinerton Builders, to the District, and that certain other action be taken and authorized:

WHEREAS, the Sublease includes construction provisions with which Swinerton Builders, shall comply with respect to construction of the Project ("Construction Services Agreement");

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 17402 of the Education Code, the plans and specifications for the Project must be prepared and adopted prior to entering into Site Lease and the Sublease agreement for the Project ("Plans and Specifications");

WHEREAS, the Plans and Specifications have been approved by the Division of State Architect ("DSA");

WHEREAS, in order to ensure that moneys sufficient to pay all costs will be available for the Project, the District desires to appropriate funds for the Project from its current fiscal year as provided by the Sublease;

WHEREAS, the Board has been presented with the Plans and Specifications for the Project and has examined and approves of such documents, subject to minor revisions, if any, by DSA, and subject to the delegation of authority provided by the Board as set forth below;

WHEREAS, the Board has been presented with the form of each document referred to herein relating to the transaction contemplated hereby and the Board has examined and approved each document and desires to authorize and direct the execution of such documents and the consummation of such transaction, subject to the delegation of authority provided by the Board as set forth below;

WHEREAS, all acts, conditions, and things required by the laws of the State of California to exist, to have happened and to have been performed precedent to and in connection with the consummation of the transaction authorized hereby, do exist, have happened and have been

performed in regular and due time, form and manner as required by law, and the District is now duly authorized and empowered, pursuant to each and every requirement of law, to consummate such financing for the purpose, in the manner, and upon the terms herein provided.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE BOARD OF EDUCATION OF THE PLACENTIA- YORBA LINDA UNIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT DOES HEREBY RESOLVE, DETERMINE, AND ORDER AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Recitals. All of the recitals herein contained are true and correct.

Section 2. <u>Site Lease and Sublease</u>. The form of agreement entitled "Site Lease" and the form of agreement entitled "Sublease" (with Construction Services Agreement attached thereto as Exhibit "D"), each presented to this meeting and each to be entered into by and between the District and Swinerton Builders, which together provide generally for (i) the lease by the District of the Site to Swinerton Builders, (ii) the sublease of the Site and the lease of the Project by Swinerton Builders, to the District, and (iii) the payment of certain lease payments by the District under the Sublease in an amount equal to the aggregate construction costs for the Project as set forth in the Construction Services Agreement ("Lease Payments") are hereby approved subject to any revisions which are acceptable to both District's Superintendent ("Superintendent") and District's legal counsel. The Superintendent or their designee is hereby authorized and directed, for and in the name and on behalf of the District, to execute and deliver to Swinerton Builders, such agreements, once finalized, pursuant to the delegation of authority provided for hereby.

Section 3. <u>Approval of Process.</u> The Governing Board hereby approves of the lease-leaseback process and approves of the Guaranteed Maximum Price amount of ELEVEN MILLION FOUR HUNDRED FORTY-NINE THOUSAND, SIX HUNDRED TWENTY-THREE DOLLARS AND FORTY-FIVE CENTS (\$11,449,623.45) plus a District Contingency amount of SIX HUNDRED THOUSAND DOLLARS AND FIFTY-FIVE CENTS (\$600,000.55), for a total amount of TWELVE MILLION FORTY-NINE THOUSAND, SIX HUNDRED TWENTY-FOUR DOLLARS (\$12,049,624.00), for the construction of the Project pursuant to the terms of the Construction Services Agreement.

Section 4. <u>Approval of Plans and Specifications</u>. The Governing Board hereby approves of the DSA-approved Plans and Specifications for the Project.

Section 5. <u>Validation Action</u>. The Board hereby authorizes District counsel to file and litigate an appropriate validation action, as required, in the appropriate court with respect to the construction of the Project and the matters approved by this Resolution.

Section 6. Other Acts; Delegation. The District's Governing Board hereby approves a delegation of authority and appoints the District Superintendent, or the designee of the District Superintendent, who is/are hereby authorized and directed, to execute and deliver the Site Lease and Sublease as provided by Section 2 above, execute and deliver documents and/or negotiate documents with Swinerton Builders, and as required execute court pleadings or documents necessary to effectuate the prompt litigation of the validation action, and to do any and all things necessary, in consultation with the staff, that they may deem necessary or advisable in order to effectuate the purpose and intent of this Resolution, all subject to ratification of the Board of Education, if necessary. Said delegation shall be valid during the construction of the Project, or until otherwise rescinded by the Governing Board.

Section 7. Effective Date. This Resolution shall take effect upon adoption.

RESOLUTION NO. 19 AGREEMENT REGARDING THE IMPOSITION AND PAYMENT OF CAPITAL FACILITIES CAPACITY CHARGES

This Agreement Regarding the Imposition and Payment of Capital Facilities Capacity Charges ("Agreement") is entered into between the Orange County Sanitation District ("OCSD") and the Placentia-Yorba Linda Unified School District ("the District"). The Agreement is effective upon approval of the governing boards of the District and OCSD. OCSD and the District are sometimes individually referred to in this Agreement as each "Party," and collectively referred to as the "Parties."

RECITALS

Whereas, OCSD collects, treats, and disposes of wastewater generated within its boundaries. The District owns and operates properties within OCSD's boundaries, and discharges wastewater from these properties to the OCSD collection, treatment, and disposal system.

Whereas, OCSD levies a fee on property owners known as the "Capital Facilities Capacity Charge" ("CFCC"). OCSD uses CFCC revenues to pay for the capital construction of new facilities to accommodate projected growth. Property owners must pay the CFCC when they (1) newly connect to OCSD's system, or (2) expand the use of property that is already connected to OCSD's system. The requirements for payment of CFCCs are currently set forth in Ordinance No. OCSD-40.

Whereas, OCSD calculates the amount of CFCCs for non-residential properties based on, *inter alia*, the estimated relative demand for water associated with different property uses. OCSD categorizes each non-residential property use as low demand, average demand, or high demand. Currently, the base CFCC charges for low demand uses and average demand uses are Two Hundred and Seventy-Nine dollars (\$279) and One Thousand Seven Hundred and Thirty-Four dollars (\$1,734), respectively, per 1,000 square feet of a new or expanded structure.

Whereas, Sections 2.11 and 2.12 of Ordinance OCSD-40 specify how CFCCs are calculated for replacement structures and remodeled structures. Under these sections CFCCs are, in effect, based on the net increase in square footage of a replacement or remodeled structure as compared with the previously existing structure.

Whereas, Ordinance No. OCSD-40 currently requires OCSD to adjust the amount of CFCCs annually based on the increase in the Engineering News-Record construction cost index for Los Angeles ("ENR Index") as of December of the prior year. CFCCs are also adjusted periodically based on updates to OCSD's Facilities Master Plan. Each Master Plan identifies the capital improvement projects that will be necessary over the following twenty years to meet OCSD's needs, and the estimated cost of those projects. The CFCCs are based on the cost estimates set forth in the most recent Facilities Master Plan.

Whereas, pursuant to California Government Code Section 54999.3, OCSD and the District have negotiated the terms under which the District will pay CFCCs to OCSD. These terms are set forth in this Agreement.

AGREEMENT

NOW, THEREFORE, THE PARTIES AGREE AS FOLLOWS:

1. <u>Low Demand Category</u>. For purposes of calculating CFCCs, OCSD shall categorize the District's use of property that it owns within OCSD as "low demand."

2. Payment of CFCCs. Effective July 1, 2011, the District shall pay CFCCs to OCSD pursuant to the requirements of Ordinance No. OCSD-40, as those requirements may be amended from time to time through successor ordinances, resolutions, and/or other documents. Without limiting the foregoing, the District acknowledges that the amount of the CFCC may be adjusted annually based on the ENR Index, and otherwise adjusted periodically based on updates to OCSD's Facilities Master Plan, all as described in the Recitals above.

- 3. <u>Property Leased to Others Non-Education Related Uses</u>. The District acknowledges that Section 1 above does not apply to property that the District leases to another person or entity for a purpose unrelated to education. OCSD may categorize any such property as average or high demand, as appropriate, based on the policies and criteria in place when the CFCC is imposed.
- 4. <u>Termination</u>. The obligations of the Parties under this Agreement shall terminate if and when OCSD should ever (1) recategorize the District's use of property that it owns as either average demand or high demand, or (2) modify the CFCC requirements such that CFCCs for replacement and remodeled structures are not, in effect, based on the net increase in square footage of a replacement or remodeled structure as compared with the previously existing structure. If the Agreement is so terminated, the District shall remain responsible for CFCCs incurred prior to termination.
- 5. <u>Attorneys Fees and Costs</u>. The Parties shall bear their own attorneys fees and costs incurred in connection with this matter, including but not limited to fees and costs incurred in connection with the Board Proceeding and the preparation of this Agreement.
- 6. <u>Notices</u>. Any notice, request, demand, consent, approval or other communication required or permitted hereunder or by law shall be deemed given or made only if in writing and deposited in the United States mail, postage prepaid and addressed to the party for whom intended, addressed as follows, or to such other address as may, from, time to time, be designated by written notice to the other Parties:

7. <u>Entire Agreement</u>. This Agreement constitutes the entire understanding between the Parties hereto with respect to the subject matter set forth herein and supersedes any and all prior or other contemporaneous understandings, correspondence, negotiations, or agreements, written or oral between them respecting the within subject matter.

8. <u>Amendments in Writing</u>. Any amendments to this Agreement must be in writing and signed by all of the Parties.

- 9. <u>Successors and Assigns</u>. The terms and conditions of this Agreement shall inure to the benefit of, and be binding upon the Parties and their respective heirs, representatives, successors and assigns.
- 10. <u>Interpretation</u>. This Agreement is the result of negotiations in which each party was represented by counsel of their own selection. Each of the Parties hereby waives any provisions of law to the effect that an ambiguity in a contract or agreement should be interpreted against the Party that drafted the contract, agreement or instrument.
- 11. <u>Governing Law</u>. This Contract shall be governed by and construed according to the laws of California.
- 12. <u>No Admission of Liability</u>. This is a compromise settlement of disputed claims. Neither the execution of this Agreement nor anything contained in it is intended to be, nor shall be deemed to be, an admission by either party of any liability to anyone or an admission of the existence of facts upon which liability could be based.
- 13. <u>Ownership of Claims</u>. The Parties, and each of them, hereby warrant that they are the owners of, and the party legally entitled to settle and release, every claim referred to herein.
- 14. <u>Severability</u>. In the event any part of this Agreement should be found invalid, unenforceable, or nonbinding, the remaining portion will remain in force and fully binding.
- 15. <u>Counterparts</u>. This Agreement may be executed in one or more counterparts, each of which shall be deemed an original but all of which together shall constitute one and the same agreement.
