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RESOLUTION NO. 27

RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF EDUCATION OF THE PLACENTIA-YORBA LINDA UNIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT AUTHORIZING THE EXECUTION AND DELIVERY OF A SITE LEASE AND SUBLEASE AND OTHER ACTS RELATING TO THE AUDITORIUM HVAC PROJECT AT VALENCIA HIGH SCHOOL

WHEREAS, the Placentia-Yorba Linda Unified School District ("District") desires to construct improvements on a portion of the Valencia High School campus as a lease-leaseback project whereby the District will lease the Site which the District owns to **JRH Construction Company, Inc.**, who will construct the Project thereon and lease the Project and underlying Site back to the District;

WHEREAS, Education Code Section 17406 authorizes the governing board of a school district, without advertising for bids, to let to any person, firm or corporation any real property belonging to the district if the instrument by which such property is let requires the lessee to construct on the demised premises, a building or buildings for use of the school district during the term thereof, and provides that title to the building shall vest in the school at the expiration of that term;

WHEREAS, it is in the best interest of the District to cause the construction of the Project through lease and sublease of the Site pursuant to Education Code Section 17406;

WHEREAS, in order to complete the Project, it is necessary that the District enter into the Site Lease, in which the Site will be leased to **JRH Construction Company**, **Inc.**, and a Sublease which provides for the sublease of the Site and the lease of the Project by **JRH Construction Company**, **Inc.**, to the District, and that certain other action be taken and authorized;

WHEREAS, the Sublease includes construction provisions with which **JRH Construction Company, Inc.**, shall comply with respect to construction of the Project ("Construction Services Agreement");

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 17402 of the Education Code, the plans and specifications for the Project must be prepared and adopted prior to entering into Site Lease and the Sublease agreement for the Project ("Plans and Specifications");

WHEREAS, the Plans and Specifications have been approved by the Division of State Architect ("DSA");

WHEREAS, in order to ensure that moneys sufficient to pay all costs will be available for the Project, the District desires to appropriate funds for the Project from its current fiscal year as provided by the Sublease;

WHEREAS, the Board has been presented with the Plans and Specifications for the Project and has examined and approves of such documents, subject to minor revisions, if any, by DSA, and subject to the delegation of authority provided by the Board as set forth below;

WHEREAS, the Board has been presented with the form of each document referred to herein relating to the transaction contemplated hereby and the Board has examined and approved each document and desires to authorize and direct the execution of such documents and the consummation of such transaction, subject to the delegation of authority provided by the Board as set forth below:

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WHEREAS, all acts, conditions, and things required by the laws of the State of California to exist, to have happened and to have been performed precedent to and in connection with the consummation of the transaction authorized hereby, do exist, have happened and have been performed in regular and due time, form and manner as required by law, and the District is now duly authorized and empowered, pursuant to each and every requirement of law, to consummate such financing for the purpose, in the manner, and upon the terms herein provided.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE BOARD OF EDUCATION OF THE PLACENTIA- YORBA LINDA UNIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT DOES HEREBY RESOLVE, DETERMINE, AND ORDER AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Recitals. All of the recitals herein contained are true and correct.

Section 2. <u>Site Lease and Sublease</u>. The form of agreement entitled "Site Lease" and the form of agreement entitled "Sublease" (with Construction Services Agreement attached thereto as Exhibit "D"), each presented to this meeting and each to be entered into by and between the District and **JRH Construction Company, Inc.**, which together provide generally for (i) the lease by the District of the Site to **JRH Construction Company, Inc.**, (ii) the sublease of the Site and the lease of the Project by **JRH Construction Company, Inc.**, to the District, and (iii) the payment of certain lease payments by the District under the Sublease in an amount equal to the aggregate construction costs for the Project as set forth in the Construction Services Agreement ("Lease Payments") are hereby approved subject to any revisions which are acceptable to both District's Superintendent ("Superintendent") and District's legal counsel. The Superintendent or their designee is hereby authorized and directed, for and in the name and on behalf of the District, to execute and deliver to **JRH Construction Company, Inc.**, such agreements, once finalized, pursuant to the delegation of authority provided for hereby.

Section 3. <u>Approval of Process</u>. The Governing Board hereby approves of the lease-leaseback process and approves of the Guaranteed Maximum Price amount of **ONE MILLION**, THIRTY-THREE THOUSAND, SEVEN HUNDRED EIGHTY-THREE DOLLARS AND 00 CENTS (\$1,033,783.00) plus a District Contingency amount of ONE HUNDRED THREE THOUSAND, THREE HUNDRED SEVENTY-EIGHT DOLLARS AND 00 CENTS (\$103,378.00), for a total amount of ONE MILLION, ONE HUNDRED THIRTY-SEVEN THOUSAND, ONE HUNDRED SIXTY-ONE DOLLARS AND 00 CENTS (\$1,137,161.00), for the construction of the Project pursuant to the terms of the Construction Services Agreement.

Section 4. <u>Approval of Plans and Specifications</u>. The Governing Board hereby approves of the DSA-approved Plans and Specifications for the Project.

Section 5. <u>Validation Action</u>. The Board hereby authorizes District counsel to file and litigate an appropriate validation action, as required, in the appropriate court with respect to the construction of the Project and the matters approved by this Resolution.

Section 6. Other Acts; Delegation. The District's Governing Board hereby approves a delegation of authority and appoints the District Superintendent, or the designee of the District Superintendent, who is/are hereby authorized and directed, to execute and deliver the Site Lease and Sublease as provided by Section 2 above, execute and deliver documents and/or negotiate documents with JRH Construction Company, Inc., and as required execute court pleadings or documents necessary to effectuate the prompt litigation of the validation action, and to do any and all things necessary, in consultation with the staff, that they may deem necessary or advisable in order to effectuate the purpose and intent of this Resolution, all subject to ratification of the Board of Education, if necessary. Said delegation shall be valid during the construction of the Project, or until otherwise rescinded by the Governing Board.

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Section 7. <u>Effective Date</u>. This Resolution shall take effect upon adoption.

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Tentative Agreement

May 23, 2013

This Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) represents the completion of the negotiations process for the 2012-13 school year and describes the effects of certificated employee furlough days and flexibility in class size increases. This Memorandum of Understanding shall not be precedent setting. The provisions of this MOU shall sunset at the end of the agreement on June 30, 2014.

The District and Association agree to the following:

1. Article XI: Class Size

- 1) Industrial Arts, Vocational Shops, Fine Arts, and Homemaking (Lab) shall be modified from 33 to 36; Physical Education shall be modified from 50 to 55 and Continuation School from 20 to 25.
- 2) Unless the maximums are exceeded beyond any continuous three-week period by 2, or otherwise provided by item 3 below, the relief measures outlined in provision C(2) of Article XI of the Collective Bargaining Agreement will not be implemented.
 - a. Additional instructional aide time
 - b. Release from selected adjunct duties
 - c. Release from selected site duties
 - d. Additional release time for classroom preparation
 - e. Clerical assistance
 - f. Reduction of class size in other sections taught
- 3) Any class that contains 1 or more SDC, or 1 or more RSP, or two or more students on a 504 plan and exceeds the class size maximums outlined in Article XI, sections A and B, shall receive the relief measures as set forth in the provisions of Article XI, Section C(2). All relief measure agreements pursuant to Article XI, Section C(2) shall be in writing and signed by the site administrator and the unit member. A copy of these agreements shall be sent to the District Human Resources Office and the Association.
- Article XIV: Wages and Benefits Furlough Days and Step Advancement

Bargaining unit members shall be furloughed with a pro-rata reduction of pay as follows:

For the 2013-14 school year bargaining unit members shall take three (3) furlough days equating to a 1.62% decrease in salary. Furlough day reductions will be realized equally over a 10 month pay period.

The District adopted budget assumes Local Control Funding Formula (LCFF) funding as defined in the School Services of California Dartboard (LCFF Planning Factors) published with the May Revise. This equates to approximately an additional \$5 million (including the 1.56% COLA) above the District's total revenue (Revenues is defined as total revenues less federal revenue that is legally available for salaries and benefits) for the 2012-13 fiscal year. This assumes that the additional \$5 million is legally available to be allocated to salaries and benefits.

After the adoption of the state budget, if the District's total revenue for 2013-14 fiscal year is not greater than \$3,110,000 above the total district revenues as received in 2012-13 fiscal year, the District or Association has the ability to re-open negotiations within 10 working days of receipt of the Adopted State Budget.

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After the adoption of the state budget, if the District's total revenue for 2013-14 fiscal year is greater than \$6,890,000 above the total district revenues as received in 2012-13 fiscal year, the District or Association has the ability to re-open negotiations within 10 working days of receipt of the Adopted State Budget.

3. Equity

It is the basis of this agreement that the other units (management and classified) will receive furlough days or salary reduction which result in an equitable reduction in salary. In the event that this does not occur the parties will meet to reduce the cuts provided for in this MOU accordingly.

4. Equity in 6th Grade

Recommended changes from the assessment equity committee will be implemented in the 2013-14 school year.

5. Additional Time for Elementary Grading

Report Card Grading

1st Trimester 1 minimum day

2nd Trimester 1 minimum day

3rd Trimester 1 minimum day

Writing Prompt Assessment

Sample student work (4,3,2,1) to calibrate/score (maximum 4 student samples per teacher) All schools will use 1 PLC day as designated by the district.

6. Management Communication

The district agrees that all principals in the district shall be trained in assigning class loads to account for the impacts that various groups of students have on the ability of the teacher to deliver high quality instruction.

Additional language to be added to the contract. (Will not sunset with the Tentative Agreement)

1. Modify Article 10, Section C(6)(a) to read as follows:

"Leave which is credited under Article X, Section C.1. may be used, at the member's election, for purposes of personal necessity provided that the use of such personal necessity leave does not exceed ten (10) days in any school year. Such leave shall be deducted from accrued sick leave."

- 2. Modify Article 10, Section C(6)(b)(5) to read as follows:
 - "(5) <u>All ten (10) days</u> of personal necessity leave may be used for reasons of compelling personal importance. <u>The nature of the compelling personal importance need not be disclosed."</u>

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3. Modify Article 18, Section F(2) to read as follows:

Classroom visitations shall be scheduled to minimalize disruption to classroom activities whenever possible, taking into account the needs of the school, the teacher, the parent, and the students, per Board Policy 6152a.2. Whenever a teacher reasonably believes that a classroom visitation has been unduly disruptive, or in any way is violative of Education Code Sections 44810 or 44811, the teacher shall report the disruption to the site administrator, who shall investigate the matter and take appropriate action within five (5) working days."

- 4. Add Article 18, Section F(3) to read as follows:
 - "3. Unless impossible, all parent classroom visitations during the instructional day shall be scheduled in advance through the site administrator in coordination with the classroom teacher."
- 4. Add Article 18, Section F(4) to read as follows:
 - "4. The District shall take timely action to promote civility in parent communications with teachers."
- 5. Add Article 18, Section I to read as follows:
 - "I. Special Education Advisory Committee (SEAC)
 - The intent of the SEAC is to provide transparency, discussion, research and debate on special education issues, including but not limited to the impact of special education on the general education classroom.
 - The Association and District shall designate the SEAC to discuss and advise on special education issues. The SEAC shall be composed of five (5) official members designated by the District and five (5) official members designated by the Association.
 - 3. The SEAC shall meet at least once each month of the school year. Any official member of the SEAC may request information, updates and/or agendize a topic within the scope of the Committee. The Committee shall determine the procedures of how it will conduct the business of the Committee.
 - 4. The SEAC will develop and recommend to their respective bargaining teams proposed special education related language changes to the collective bargaining agreement as deemed necessary and appropriate by the Committee."
- 7. Add new paragraph to Article 11, Section G as follows:

<u>"Every effort shall be made to assign combination classes on an equitable basis within a school site."</u>

8. Modify Article 16, Section E (1) in part as follows:

"1. Staff meetings conducted during the student school year shall not exceed nine (9) meetings per year..."

Initial Proposal of the California School Employees Association and its Placentia-Yorba Linda
Chapter #293
To the Placentia Yorba Linda Unified School District

For Successor Contract Negotiations

Article I: Agreement

CSEA #293 desires a new successor contract with a duration of three (3) years with reopeners during the 2nd and 3rd years of the contract.

Article III: Definition

CSEA #293 desires to modify the definition of Association to reflect: "The California School Employees and its Placentia-Yorba Linda Chapter #293.

CSEA #293 desires to include a definition of a "transfer."

Article VI: Unit Member Rights

CSEA #293 desires that each unit member be provided a secure mailbox for their own use.

CSEA #293 seeks to address District provided email addresses for unit members.

Article VII: Association Rights

CSEA #293 seeks to explore security options for unit members.

CSEA #293 seeks an opportunity to address newly hired unit members during new District employee orientation.

CSEA #293 desires that the District shall provide one set of printed labels at District expense of unit members demographic information as requested no more than twice a year.

CSEA #293 desires that a Personnel Office Staff manager participate on the interview panel of every unit position that is health insurance benefit eligible in addition to each other interview panel designated by the Chapter.

Article XII: General Personnel Provisions

CSEA #293 desires that the District shall inform the Chapter of all vacancies within the bargaining unit within one week of the creation of the vacancy.

CSEA #293 desires to delete section 12.2.2

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CSEA #293 desires to address the notification required to laid off members in Section 12.3.

CSEA #293 desires to address the role of the interview panel and interview process in determining the applicant selected for a position.

CSEA #293 desires to address the process by which applicants are pre-screened for qualifications and references.

CSEA #293 desires that interviews for a unit position must be conducted within a period of time after the closing of a position.

CSEA #293 desires that the selection process for unit member positions shall cease upon CSEA #293's submission of a grievance regarding hiring practices until the matter has been resolved.

CSEA #293 desires that each vacancy announcement shall identify the position's number of paid days within a calendar year.

CSEA #293 desires to ensure that employees' classification of months are properly ascribed based on the number of paid work days.

CSEA #293 desires that unit members who so desire may request a conference with the Director of Personnel in the event that the unit member was denied a transfer request.

Article XIV: Layoff and Re-Employment

CSEA #293 desires that members laid off for medical reasons retain all protections and abilities provided to members laid off due to lack of work or lack of funds.

CSEA #293 desires that unit members laid off shall be provided the opportunity for all short term and substitute hours in the positions they were laid off from. Additionally, CSEA #293 desires that laid off members be offered short term and substitute hours for positions that laid off members meet the qualifications for but for which the laid off members may not have served in prior to such hours being offered to non-bargaining unit members.

CSEA #293 desires that the District shall provide the Chapter by the 1st of each month a list of unit members on a layoff/rehire list, the members' classifications, locations, type of layoff and the time each laid off unit member has remaining for recall purposes.
