UNIFORM COMPLAINT PROCEDURES

The Board of Education recognizes that the District is primarily responsible for complying with applicable state and federal laws and regulations governing educational programs. The District shall investigate any complaint alleging failure to comply with such laws and/or alleging unlawful discrimination, harassment, intimidation, or bullying and shall seek to resolve those complaints in accordance with the district's uniform complaint procedures.

The district shall use the uniform complaint procedures to resolve any complaint alleging the district's failure to comply with state and/or federal laws or regulations governing adult education programs, consolidated categorical aid programs, migrant education, career technical and technical education and training programs, special education programs, child care and development programs, child nutrition programs, after school education and safety programs, and the development and adoption of the school safety plan.

The district shall use the uniform complaint procedures to resolve any complaint alleging unlawful discrimination, harassment, intimidation, or bullying against any student, employee, or other person as identified with actual or perceived characteristics such as race or ethnicity, color, ancestry, national origin, nationality, ethnic group identification, age, religion, marital, pregnancy or parental status, physical or mental disability, sex, sexual orientation, gender, gender identity or expression, or genetic information, or on the basis of a person's association with a person or group with one or more of these actual or perceived characteristics, in any program or activity conducted by the district or that is funded directly by, or that receives or benefits from any state financial assistance.

The compliance officer/investigating staff are required to review and follow the procedural guidelines outlined in AR 5145.7 – Sexual Harassment of Students.

The district shall use the uniform complaint procedures to resolve any complaint alleging district noncompliance with the requirement to provide reasonable accommodation to a lactating student on school campus to express breast milk, breastfeed an infant child, or address other breastfeeding-related needs of the student.

The district shall use the uniform complaint procedures to resolve any complaint alleging district noncompliance with the prohibition against requiring students to pay fees, deposits, or other charges for participation in educational activities.

The district shall use the uniform complaint procedures to resolve any complaint alleging district noncompliance with legal requirements related to the implementation of the local control and accountability plan.

The district shall use the uniform complaint procedures to resolve any complaint, by or on behalf of any student who is a foster youth, a former juvenile court school pupil, of a homeless student as defined by 42 USC 11434a alleging district noncompliance with any legal requirement applicable to the student regarding placement decisions, the responsibilities of the district's educational liaison to the student, the award of credit for coursework satisfactorily completed in another school or district, school transfer, or the grant of an exemption from Board-imposed graduation requirements.

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The district shall use the uniform complaint procedures to resolve any complaint alleging district noncompliance with the requirements of Education Code 51228.1 and 51228.2 that prohibit the assignment of a student to a course without educational content for more than one week in any semester or to a course the student has previously satisfactorily completed, without meeting specified conditions.

The district shall use the uniform complaint procedures to resolve any complaint alleging district noncompliance with the physical education instructional minutes requirement for students in elementary school.

The district shall use the uniform complaint procedures to resolve any complaint alleging district noncompliance with the requirement to provide certificated school site employees who serve pupils in any of the grades 7 to 12 information on existing school site and community resources related to the support of lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender, and questioning (LGBTQ) pupils.

The district shall use the uniform complaint procedures to resolve any complaint alleging retaliation against a complainant or other participant in the complaint process or anyone who has acted to uncover or report a violation subject to this policy.

The district shall use the uniform complaint procedures to resolve any other complaint as specified in a district policy.

The district's Williams uniform complaint procedures, AR 1312.4, shall be used to investigate and resolve any complaint related to the following:

- 1. Sufficiency of textbooks or instructional materials
- 2. Emergency or urgent facilities conditions that pose a threat to the health or safety of students or staff
- 3. Teacher vacancies and mis-assignments

When an allegation that is not subject to the UCP is included in a UCP complaint, the district may refer the non-UCP allegation to the appropriate staff or agency and shall investigate and, if appropriate, resolve the UCP related allegation(s) through the district's UCP.

The following complaints shall not be subject to the district's UCP but shall be referred to the specified agency:

- Any complaint alleging child abuse or neglect shall be referred to the County Department of Social Services, the County Protective Services Division, and the appropriate law enforcement agency.
- 2. Any complaint alleging health and safety violations by a child development program shall, for licensed facilities, be referred to Department of Social Services and shall, for licensing-exempt facilities, be referred to the appropriate Child Development regional administrator.
- Any complaint alleging employment discrimination shall be sent to the California Department of Fair Employment and Housing and the compliance officer shall notify the complainant by first class mail of the transfer.
- 4. Any complaint alleging fraud shall be referred to the California Department of Education.

If the complainant is not satisfied with the decision of the school district, the individual may appeal the decision to the State Superintendent of Public Instruction. The State Superintendent of Public Instruction is required to issue a decision on the appeal within 60 days of the Superintendent of Public Instruction's receipt of the appeal. If the school district finds merit in the complaint or the Superintendent of Public Instruction finds merit in an appeal, the school district will provide a remedy to all affected pupils, parents, and guardians.

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The Board encourages the early informal resolution of complaints at the site level whenever possible.

The Board acknowledges and respects every individual's right to privacy. Discrimination complaints and complaints of retaliation shall be investigated in a manner that protects the confidentiality of the parties and the integrity of the process to the maximum extent permitted by law. This may include keeping the identity of the complainant confidential, as appropriate and except to the extent necessary to carry out the investigation or proceedings, as determined by the Superintendent or designee, on a case-by-case basis.

The Board prohibits any form of retaliation against any complainant in the complaint process, including but not limited to a complainant's filing of a complaint, the reporting of instances of discrimination, or for participation in complaint procedures. Such participation shall not in any way affect the status, grades, or work assignments of the complainant.

The Board recognizes that mediation can, depending on the nature of the allegation, offer a process to reach a resolution to the complaint that is acceptable to all parties. Mediation may be offered to resolve complaints that involve more than one student and no adult. However, mediation shall not be offered or used to resolve any complaint involving sexual assault or where there is reasonable risk that a party to the mediation would feel compelled to participate.

In accordance with uniform complaint procedures, whenever all parties to a complaint voluntarily agree to try resolving their problem through mediation, the Assistant Superintendent of Educational Services shall initiate that process and ensure that the results are consistent with state and federal laws and regulations. If the parties agree to mediation, the district and complainant will agree in writing to mediate the complaint and that either the complaint will be withdrawn or the timelines of the uniform complaint process will be tolled until resolution or the mediation process is no longer continued. Either party may discontinue the mediation process upon written notice to the other party.

The Superintendent or designee shall provide training to designated district staff to ensure awareness and knowledge of current law and related requirements, including the steps and timelines specified in this policy and the accompanying administrative regulations. Such employees may have access to legal counsel as determined by the Superintendent or designee.

The Superintendent or designees shall maintain records of all UCP complaints and the investigations of those complaints in accordance with applicable law and district policy.

In compliance with state law, when 15% or more of the students in the district speak a single primary language other than English, notification regarding Uniform Complaint Procedures shall also be provided in that language.

NONDISCRIMINATION/HARASSMENT

The Board of Education of the Placentia-Yorba Linda Unified School District is committed to providing a safe school environment that allows all students equal access and opportunities in the district's academic, extracurricular, and other educational support programs, services, and activities. The Board prohibits, at any district school or school activity, unlawful discrimination, including discriminatory harassment, intimidation, and/or bullying targeted at any student by anyone, on the basis of student's actual or perceived race, color, ancestry, national origin, nationality, ethnicity, ethnic group identification, age, religion, marital or parental status, mental or physical disability, sex, sexual orientation, gender, gender identity, or gender expression or association with a person or group with one or more of these actual or perceived characteristics.

This policy shall apply to all acts related to school activity or to school attendance occurring within a district school, and to acts which occur off campus or outside of school-related or school-sponsored activities which may have an impact or create a hostile environment at school.

Unlawful discrimination, including discriminatory harassment, intimidation, or bullying, may result from physical, verbal, nonverbal, or written conduct based on any of the categories listed above. Unlawful discrimination also includes the creation of a hostile environment through prohibited conduct that is so severe, persistent, or pervasive that it affects a student's ability to participate in or benefit from an educational program or activity; creates an intimidating, threatening, hostile, or offensive educational environment; has the effect of substantially or unreasonably interfering with a student's academic performance; or otherwise adversely affects a student's educational opportunities.

Unlawful discrimination also includes disparate treatment of students based on one of the categories above with respect to the provision of opportunities to participate in school programs or activities or the provision or receipt of educational benefits or services.

The Board also prohibits any form of retaliation against any individual who reports or participates in the reporting of unlawful discrimination, files or participates in the filing of a complaint, or investigates or participates in the investigation of a complaint or report alleging unlawful discrimination. Retaliation complaints shall be investigated and resolved in the same manner as a discrimination complaint.

The Superintendent or designee shall facilitate students' access to the educational program by publicizing the district's nondiscrimination policy and related complaint procedures to students, parents/guardians, and employees. He/she shall provide training and information on the scope and use of the policy and complaint procedures and take other measures designed to increase the school community's understanding of the requirements of law related to discrimination. The Superintendent or designee shall regularly review the implementation of the district's nondiscrimination policies and practices and, as necessary, shall take action to remove any identified barrier to student access to or participation in the district's educational program. He/she shall report his/her findings and recommendations to the Board after each review.

Regardless of whether a complainant complies with the writing, timeline, and/or other formal filing requirements, all complaints alleging unlawful discrimination, including discriminatory harassment, intimidation, or bullying, shall be investigated and prompt action taken to stop the discrimination, prevent recurrence, and address any continuing effect on students.

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Students who engage in unlawful discrimination, including discriminatory harassment, intimidation, retaliation, or bullying, in violation of law, Board policy, or administrative regulation shall be subject to appropriate consequence or discipline, which may include suspension or expulsion when the behavior is severe or pervasive as defined in Education Code 48900.4. Any employee who permits or engages in prohibited discrimination, including discriminatory harassment, intimidation, retaliation, or bullying, shall be subject to disciplinary action, up to and including dismissal.

Any student who feels that he/she is being harassed or who observes an incident of harassment should immediately contact the principal or designee. If a situation involving harassment is not promptly remedied by the principal or designee, a complaint alleging discrimination/harassment can be filed with the district's compliance officer in accordance with the Uniform Complaint Procedures set forth in BP 1312.3 and AR 1312.3.

This policy shall be posted in all schools and offices including student government meeting rooms and the library.

Record Keeping

The Superintendent or designee shall maintain a record of all reported cases of unlawful discrimination, including discriminatory harassment, intimidation, or bullying, to enable the district to monitor, address, and prevent repetitive prohibited behavior in district schools.

SEXUAL HARASSMENT OF STUDENTS

The governing board of the Placentia-Yorba Linda Unified School reaffirms its commitment to the safety and well-being of all its students and, therefore, prohibits unlawful sexual harassment of or by any student by anyone in or from the district. The Board prohibits sexual harassment of students at school or at school-sponsored or school-related activities.

Moreover, it is the intent of the board to ensure that all students be aware that they need not endure any form of sexual harassment. As such, this policy shall be posted, distributed to students and employees, and included in the annual notice to parents/guardians.

Any student who engages in the sexual harassment of anyone in or from the district may be subject to disciplinary action up to and including expulsion. Any employee who permits or engages in sexual harassment of students may be subject to disciplinary action up to and including dismissal.

The district strongly encourages any student who feels that he/she is being or has been sexually harassed by another student or an adult on school grounds or at a school-sponsored or school-related activity off-campus to immediately contact his/her teacher, the principal, or any other available school employee. In addition, any student who feels that he/she has been sexually harassed off-campus and is concerned about or reports an impact on campus or school-related activity, even if the off-campus misconduct did not occur in the context of a school related activity, should immediately report the incident to any available school employee so the district can determine whether there is a hostile environment at school or in an off-campus school program or activity. Any employee who receives a report or observes an incident of sexual harassment shall notify the principal or a district compliance officer. Once notified, the principal or compliance officer shall take steps to investigate and address the allegation, as specified in the accompanying administrative regulation.

The district prohibits retaliatory behavior against any complainant or any participant in the complaint process. Each complaint of sexual harassment shall be promptly investigated, even if the complainant requests that nothing be done or is anonymous. All information regarding the complaint shall remain confidential to the extent permitted by law.

Instruction/Information

The Superintendent or designee shall ensure that all district students receive age-appropriate information on sexual harassment. Such instruction and information shall include:

- 1. What acts and behavior constitute sexual harassment, including the fact that sexual harassment could occur between people of the same sex and could involve sexual violence
- 2. A clear message that students do not have to endure sexual harassment under any circumstance
- 3. Encouragement to report observed incidents of sexual harassment even where the alleged victim of the harassment has not complained
- 4. A clear message that student safety is the district's primary concern, and that any separate rule violation involving an alleged victim or any other person reporting a sexual harassment incident will be addressed separately and will not affect the manner in which the sexual harassment complaint will be received, investigated, or resolved

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5. A clear message that, regardless of a complainant's noncompliance with the writing or reporting requirements under the law, every sexual harassment allegation that involves a student, whether as the complainant, respondent, or victim of the harassment, shall be investigated and prompt action shall be taken to stop any current harassment, prevent recurrence, and address any continuing effects on students

- 6. Information about the district's procedure for investigating complaints and the person(s) to whom a report of sexual harassment should be made
- 7. Information about the rights of students and parents/guardians to file a civil or criminal complaint, as applicable
- 8. A clear message that, when needed, the district will take interim measures to ensure a safe school environment for a student who is the complainant or victim of sexual harassment and/or other students during an investigation and that, to the extent possible, when such interim measures are taken, they shall not disadvantage the complainant or victim of the alleged harassment

Confidentiality

All complaints and allegations of sexual harassment shall be kept confidential except as necessary to carry out the investigation or take other subsequent necessary action.

Investigations

Investigations into complaints of sexual harassment shall be conducted in accordance with AR 1312.3, Uniform Complaint Procedures. Principals are responsible for notifying students and parents/guardians that complaints of sexual harassment can be filed under AR 1312.3 and where to obtain a copy of the procedures.

Disciplinary Actions

Any student who engages in sexual harassment or sexual violence at school or at a school-sponsored or school-related activity is in violation of this policy and shall be subject to disciplinary action. For students in grades 4-12, disciplinary action may include suspension and/or expulsion, provided that, in imposing such discipline, the entire circumstances of the incident(s) shall be taken into account.

Any staff member found to have engaged in sexual harassment or sexual violence toward any student shall be subject to discipline up to and including dismissal in accordance with applicable policies, laws, and/or collective bargaining agreements.

Record Keeping

The Superintendent or designee shall maintain a record of all reported cases of sexual harassment to enable the district to monitor, address, and prevent sexual harassment in district schools.

HIGH SCHOOL ATHLETICS

Athletics are an integral part of the high school co-curricular program. The Board of Education establishes as the goals of this activity the development of proper ideals of sportsmanship, ethical conduct, teamwork, specialized physical skills, and experience in competitive situations. In attaining these goals, the program must promote and emphasize the physical, mental, moral, social, and emotional well-being of the players, those participating in supporting activities, and the spectators.

All athletic teams shall be supervised by qualified coaches to ensure that student athletes receive appropriate instruction and guidance related to safety, health, sports skills, and sportsmanship. Athletic events shall be officiated by qualified personnel.

The interscholastic athletic program will provide many opportunities for participation. The programs and teams are, however, competitive in nature. Limitations on individual participation on teams or in games may be imposed based upon the skill or achievement level of the individual, the needs of the group/team, funding limitations, and availability of staff. Accordingly, in many of the various athletic programs, the size of squads/teams will be limited.

Students should be encouraged to participate in the varied sports offerings for which they have interest and aptitude. No effort shall be made to limit a student's participation in multiple sports because that student has displayed a special aptitude or skill in a specific sport. No student shall be required to participate in a summer program as a prerequisite to trying out or qualifying for a sport during the regular school year. However, an athlete is required to report at the beginning of the official conditioning and/or practice schedule for the sport in which he/she wishes to participate.

The Board values the quality and integrity of the athletic program and the character development of student athletes. Student athletes, coaches, parents/guardians, spectators, and others are expected to demonstrate good sportsmanship, ethical conduct, and fair play during all athletic competitions. They shall also abide by the core principles of trustworthiness, respect, responsibility, fairness, caring, and good citizenship and the Codes of Conduct adopted by CIF.

The interscholastic sports program shall be conducted in accordance with the rules and regulations of the California Interscholastic Federation, California Interscholastic Federation-Southern Section, and the athletic leagues to which the high schools are assigned. The Board of Education will annually appoint the league representative who must notify the Superintendent and Board of Education regarding any CIF proposals that will financially impact the district prior to CIF action. The Superintendent will direct the representative regarding their vote, and notify the Board of Education. The high school principals, under the supervision of the Deputy Superintendent –Educational Services, are responsible to develop and implement procedures and local regulations necessary to fulfill the intent of this policy and the rules and regulations of the agencies under which the interscholastic program is conducted.

PHYSICAL EDUCATION AND ACTIVITY

The Board of Education recognizes the positive benefits of physical activity on student health and academic achievement. The District shall provide all students the opportunity to be physically active on a regular basis through high-quality physical education instruction and may provide additional opportunities for physical activity throughout the school day. The District's physical education and activity programs shall support the District's coordinated student wellness program and encourage students' lifelong fitness.

The District's physical education program shall provide a developmentally appropriate sequence of instruction aligned with the state's model content standards and curriculum framework.

For grades 9-12, the overall course of study shall include the effects of physical activity upon dynamic health, the mechanics of body movement, aquatics, gymnastics and tumbling, individual and dual sports, rhythms and dance, team sports, and combatives.

The Board shall approve the courses in grades 9-12 for which physical education credit may be granted.

The District's physical education program shall engage students in moderate to vigorous physical activity, as defined in the accompanying administrative regulation, for at least 50 percent of class or session time. The Superintendent or designee shall develop strategies to monitor the amount of moderate to vigorous physical activity that takes place in the physical education instructional program.

The Superintendent or designee shall ensure that the District's program provides students with equal opportunities for instruction and participation regardless of gender in accordance with law.

Students with disabilities shall be provided instruction in physical education in accordance with their individualized education program or Section 504 accommodation plan.

During air pollution episodes, extreme weather, or other inclement conditions, physical education staff shall make appropriate adjustments to the program or shall seek alternative indoor space to enable students to participate in active physical education.

The Superintendent or designee shall develop strategies to supplement physical education instruction with additional opportunities for students to be physically active before, during, and after the school day.

Staffing

Physical education instruction shall be delivered by appropriately credentialed teachers who may be assisted by instructional aides, paraprofessionals, and/or volunteers.

The District shall provide physical education teachers with continuing professional development, including classroom management and instructional strategies designed to keep students engaged and active and to enhance the quality of physical education instruction and assessment.

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Physical Fitness Testing

The Superintendent or designee shall annually administer the physical fitness test designated by the State Board of Education (FITNESSGRAM) to students in grades 5, 7, and 9.

Temporary Exemptions

The Superintendent or designee may grant a student a temporary exemption from physical education under either of the following conditions:

- 1. The student is ill or injured and a modified program to meet his/her needs cannot be provided.
- 2. The student is enrolled for one-half time or less.

Two-Year Exemptions

With the student's consent, the Superintendent or designee may exempt a student from physical education courses for any two years during grades 10-12 provided that the student has satisfactorily met at least five of the six standards of the FITNESSGRAM in grade 9.

Upon request by students and/or their parents/guardians, the Superintendent or designee may administer the FITNESSGRAM to students in grades 10-12 who need to pass the test in order to qualify for a two-year exemption from physical education courses.

Students in grades 10-12 who have been granted a two-year exemption shall be offered a variety of elective physical education courses of not less than 400 minutes each 10 school days.

Such students shall not be permitted to attend fewer total hours of courses and classes than they would have attended if enrolled in a physical education course.

Permanent Exemptions

The Superintendent or designee may grant a student a permanent exemption from physical education under any of the following conditions:

- 1. The student is age 16 years or older and has been enrolled in grade 10 for one or more academic years. However, such a student shall not be permitted to attend fewer total hours of courses and classes than he/she would have attended if enrolled in a physical education course.
- 2. The student is enrolled as a postgraduate student.
- 3. The student is enrolled in a juvenile home, ranch, camp, or forestry camp school with scheduled recreation and exercise.

Other Exemptions

The Superintendent or designee may grant a student an exemption from physical education under the following special circumstances:

1. When the student is in any of grades 10-12 and is excused for up to 24 clock hours in order to participate in automobile driver training. However, any such student shall attend a minimum of 7,000 minutes of physical education instruction during the school year.

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2. When the student is in any of grades 10-12, attends a regional occupational center or program, and, because of the travel time involved, would experience hardship to attend physical education courses. Any such student shall have a minimum school day of 180 minutes.

3. When the student is in high school and is engaged in a regular school-sponsored interscholastic athletic program carried on wholly or partially after regular school hours.

Program Evaluation

The Superintendent or designee shall annually report to the Board each school's FITNESSGRAM results for each applicable grade level. He/she shall also report to the Board regarding the number of instructional minutes offered in physical education for each grade level, the number of two-year and permanent exemptions granted pursuant to Education Code 51241, and any other data agreed upon by the Board and the Superintendent or designee to evaluate program quality and the effectiveness of the District's program in meeting goals for physical activity.
